9	COVID 19	Spread of infectious disease     Loss of teaching capability in key areas.	3	5	15	<ul> <li>Since March 2021, MTS has actively promoted and facilitated the use of Lateral Flow Tests and has encouraged staff and pupils to test twice a week.</li> <li>Staff and pupils are recommended to take a Lateral Flow test on the morning of the event.</li> <li>Parents will be contacted and asked not to attend if they are feeling unwell or have registered a positive Covid test within the previous 10 days.</li> <li>Parents, staff and pupils attending will be asked to wear a face covering while moving around the venue. They may remove them during their consultations if they wish to.</li> <li>Carbon Dioxide Monitors will be in place at either end of the Great Hall and will be regularly monitored. Any readings from 400-700ppm belong in the safe range. Readings of 700-1500ppm requires close observation. Anything above 1500ppm means the acceptable standard of air quality has been breached.</li> <li>Multiple hand sanitising stations will be positioned within Reception and the Great Hall.</li> <li>Windows and External Doors of the Great Hall will be open prior and during the event to maximise flow of fresh air.</li> <li>Recent large scale School events involving external guests have followed these same control measures. Following each event, we have not recorded, or been made aware of, any notable increase in Covid infections.</li> </ul>	1	5	5

#### Site Specific Information:

- 1. The Great Hall has double door fire exits on the side of the building leading directly outside.
- 2. Additional fire exits are located at the rear of the hall, on both seating levels, which lead down to the table tennis lobby.
- 3. Fire extinguishers are in place near each fire exit and fire detection equipment is also in place.
- 4. All fire-fighting and detection equipment is serviced annually.
- 5. Nominated Fire Wardens and First Aiders will be in attendance.
