# SIXTH FORM DRESS CODE

The Sixth Form Dress Code is as follows:

### Suits

ACCEPTABLE	NOT ACCEPTABLE
Single colour (navy or dark grey)	Other or Light colour(s)
Pin stripes	Chalk stripes/Different jacket/trousers***
Two or three piece*	Flares
Plain grey/black v-neck jumper	Hoodies or Round-necked jumpers

\* Waistcoats are allowed as long as they are of a single colour and part of a three-piece suit

\*\*\* Monitors (Senior Prefects) are allowed to wear a blazer and trousers as opposed to a suit

\*\*\* Monitors may wear gold MTS buttons and Prompters may wear silver MTS buttons

## Shirts

In order to create a clear distinction between the Lower Sixth Form, the Upper Sixth Form and the JCR, minor differences in the style of shirt worn with the suit are permissible.

YEAR	SHIRT
Lower Sixth	White only
Upper Sixth	White or pastel coloured (one tone)
JCR	White or pastel coloured or striped

#### Shoes

Black leather shoes only; no brown shoes or trainers.

#### Ties

Sixth Form boys must still wear a school tie for the following reasons:

- It establishes identity (School/House/teams)
- It encourages a sense of unity (within House groups/sports teams etc.)
- It acts as a valued reward system/recognition of achievement

#### Hair

Hair should be neat, tidy, and clean; it should be conventional in style and not too short (as a guide the use of No 1 or No 2 clippers will produce hair that is too short). If longer than collar length, it should be tied back at all times. It should also be one natural colour throughout.
